5:53 NM Legislature issues presented by Robert Baade

- RFK growth in students helped with the cut in the budget.
- During first 4 days of legislative session, bill was signed took 2% of the operation budget. RFK's cut is \$57,781. The cut in the budget resulted in ending the Welding Program and a freeze on the Auto Body Program. In addition, nursing position will not be replaced. However, there no impact on teachers.
- Any carry over above 3% of budget was to have been taken back by the state. No impact on RFK as carryover was fairly depleted.
- There may be another cut made by this legislature of approximately \$60,000, impacting next year's budget.
- 80-day student enrollment is 102%, the same on the 120 day.

6:12 Attendance, behavior, retention- reported by Pete Ciurczak (see attachment)

- 436 referrals were made this academic year.
- 429 reported late arrivals students weren't being held accountable, now they are tracked.
- Suspensions are down due to Trauma Informed Trainings. Also restorative justice practices are helping.
- Students have mostly been dropped because of non-attendance, not behavior.
- Only one fight at the beginning of the year.
- Most referrals have been for classroom disruption as there are a lot of new students who are still learning RFK culture.
- When students miss days for suspension- it is up to the teacher to allow missed homework.

6:30 **Student Engagement Report** – Pete Ciurczak reported for Lawrence Torres, Assistant to the Dean (not present)

- Music classes are offered two days a week and they are full.
- Radio classes and clubs are offered after school.
- Poetic and spoken word are also offered after school organized by the Social Worker Intern
- Sports (girls' volleyball and boys' basketball) are also offered for students who keep up their grades. Pete checks grades every Monday.
- Lots of interest to use the gym- community sports teams and APS.
- Seniors attended UNM and CNM senior field trips.
- Acupuncture Detox program is helping 12 to 15 students who are struggling with anxiety.
- Trauma Informed Training has been really helpful for staff.
- Art show in May in collaboration with South Valley Prep Charter High School and South Valley Academy.
- Enchilada dinners have been successful; students provide music during the dinner and many parents come to hear their child play.
- Culinary Arts day program has been successful. Offered 1-3pm.
